David Haller, in his book of interviews with children entitled *Just Build the Ark and the Animals Will Come*, received this response from Adam, age 7, when Haller asked him, "Judging from the Old Testament, how does God seem to communicate with people?"

Adam replied: "He used to do it through storms, but I think he's more quiet now."

So how is God talking to people today? Just look at the board in the narthex and look at the ways God has been sighted around the Exeter community. In looking at those stories it's a little scary to think someone may have seen God's Hands at work in YOU!

The Council has been involved over the past year with a series of workshops sponsored by the Synod titled *Do What Matters!* During the workshops participants were encouraged to look beyond the walls of our individual churches. We were encouraged to think about partnering with other churches (don't get scared – but even non-Lutherans) and even with businesses in our community to fulfill God's call to serve the least and the lost.

This is a pretty big shift in the way we've always done it. You mean Catholics and Methodists and Faith Bible and U.C.C., and even those without a church affiliation can work together with the Lutherans to start a Food Pantry in Exeter?

Permission was given during these workshops to stop doing those things in the church that don't have energy behind them even though we've always done them. The energy was great and the congregations seemed genuinely excited about new possibilities for ministry.

Another conversation piece during the most recent workshop encouraged congregations to study the book of Acts together and join in some deliberate conversations around what God is doing in the early church. We were encouraged along with such a study to involve as many people in these conversations as possible. As a result we are asking you to study three chapters a week in the book of Acts before you worship on Sunday morning. No – if you didn't do your homework you still have to come to church! We'll all be in conversation over a few weeks and discuss with one another the answers to these three questions.

1. What is God doing in this passage?
2. What is God saying to me in this passage?
3. What is God saying to us at Reformation in this passage?

Members of Reformation Evangelical Lutheran Church,

The amended Constitution of the Reformation Evangelical Lutheran Church of Reiffon was approved at the 2011 annual meeting of the congregation. This approved constitution was then forwarded to the synod for their approval. This synod review has yielded several recommendations which the Congregation Council has approved. The recommended changes, as listed in a letter dated November 7, 2011 from Catherine A. Ziel - Executive Associate of the Bishop, are as follows:

C11.02 contains a minor typographical error. "Acclimation" should be "acclamation".

C12.10 The next to last sentence ("Emergency meetings may be called...") is redundant; same meaning as the second sentence. The last sentence is unclear and should be omitted.

C13.05 Modify to agree with C9.01 by removing departing pastor from involvement with call committee.

CR4.05 Clarify by adding "of this congregation".

In addition, another typographical error was noted in CR4.06 (Oversite should be Oversight) and will be changed.

As described in C17.04 of the constitution, this amended constitution must be approved "by a simple majority vote of those voting members present and voting at a legally called meeting of the congregation".

At the annual congregational meeting in January 2012, a motion will be made to approve this new constitution. **The Congregation Council recommends voting for approval of this new constitution.**

2 Cups flour

Bake at 325 degrees for 45-50 minutes in a 9 X 13 ungreased disposable pan. When cool, dust with 10X sugar.

What Matters

What matters to me? Of course the easy answer to the question is “everything matters” or “some things matter more than others”! I could go on and on with numerous clichés or specific examples of things that matter to me personally. But what would be the point? Events important to me may be of no concern to you. No, this is not an easy question to pen an answer to in any way, shape or form. I think we really need to approach the subject in a broad manner that can be applied across all of the things which you or I may care about. In that way we can get a feel for what really matters as it applies to life. Please consider the following:


Matthew 22:36-40

"Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" He said to them, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it. 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

In this portion of the Bible, we have the Pharisees, figures of authority, people of standing in the Jewish and Roman world asking *Jesus* “What matters?” Interestingly he didn’t go into the 613 commandments or pronouncements of the Jewish religion. He didn’t talk about the kosher laws. He didn’t pay observance to the ever burdensome Roman laws. *Jesus* gave a concise, complete answer, which covers all aspects of humanity, at all times. His answer couldn’t be any better or comprehensive. Out of our *total* love of *God* and mankind everything flows. All of the trappings of life, be it your job, social status, family, income, the type of car you drive or any material things we enjoy have meaning, but, are not the true answer to the question “What matters”? If we completely love *God*, as

Not heaven’s ticket-checker, whose words have been molded
by the Church to include and exclude, judge and
stigmatize, pacify and domesticate.

The author invites you to uncover afresh the transforming message of *Jesus* – an open invitation to radical change, an enlightening revelation that exposes sham and ignites hope, an epic story that is good news for everyone, whatever their gender, race, politics or religion. Every once in-a-while you need to read a book of this nature to keep your mind and heart open to the real message, its importance and promise to all people.

THRIVENT CHOICE DOLLARS

Questions & Answers

Question: How can people donate money to Reformation and not have it cost them one cent out of their pocket?

Answer: People can designate their Thrivent Choice Dollars be given to Reformation.

Question: What are Thrivent Choice dollars?

Answer: Thrivent Choice Dollars are funds, equal to the amount of taxes Thrivent [a nonprofit fraternal organization] would normally pay on investment profits. These funds were formerly distributed to organizations on request or as matching funds.

Question: How are Thrivent Choice Dollars distributed now?

Answer: Qualifying Thrivent members must register on the Thrivent Choice Dollars website. Once registered, they can direct their portion of the funds to a qualified group or organization, such as Reformation.

Question: How do I know if I qualify for this program?

Answer: You should have received a letter from Thrivent advising you of your eligibility. However, if you cannot remember if you received the letter, contact your Thrivent representative or check their website for eligibility requirements [see below].

Question: If I qualify for the program, how do I enroll in it?

Answer: There are several ways to enroll in the program:

- Contact your Thrivent representative;
- Visit the Thrivent website;

- Contact the Church Treasurer for assistance.

Question: Once I designate my Thrivent Choice Dollars to an organization, do I have to assign them every year?

Answer: No, you can assign them to your chosen organization on a recurring basis. However, you may evaluate and change them as often as you want.

Highlights from the Congregation Council Meeting—December 20, 2011

Applebee's

We welcomed Melanie Bechtel who has volunteered to serve as Council Secretary starting with the January Council meeting. Jane Humbert is leaving the role after 20 years of service; she will be greatly missed.

Parish Concerns: 1) It was clarified that the Exeter Food Pantry is using some of the Social Hall for temporary storage until the lift gate on the truck is fixed. The shelving is too heavy to move without the assistance of a lift gate. 2) Discussion occurred on the use of the screen for announcements. Parish comments have varied widely, but the majority are neutral or positive, especially since it has proven to increase responses and communication.

The agenda of the Annual Meeting scheduled for January 22, 2012, will highlight progress on the strategic plan implementation.

The Council reviewed and approved adjustments to the 2012 proposed budget including staff pay increases and a reallocation of benevolence dollars to be 8% to synod, ½ % to West Berks Mission District and 1 ½% to Local Benevolence.

The Council voted to not approve the use of the church for the Dayspring Adult Day Care Program. It was agreed that in order to house a program of that breadth, we would need to staff the church on a full-time basis, and we are not in a position to do that at this time.

The Worship and Music Committee reported that a contemporary service will be held on the 3rd Sunday of each month at both services. We will use a full contemporary service but will try to make a comfortable transition using both familiar and new settings from the ELW hymnal (red hymnal) that have a contemporary feel. We will use modern language and a different creed. The scriptures will be read from The Message.

2012 Flower Chart

The 2012 Flower Chart is up, and there are many available Sundays for you to sponsor a vase in memory of a loved one, or in honor of someone. There are openings on **January 22nd, and 29th**, as well as **February 5th and 19th** for flowers. Vases are \$25 and you only sponsor one vase, unless you want both.
