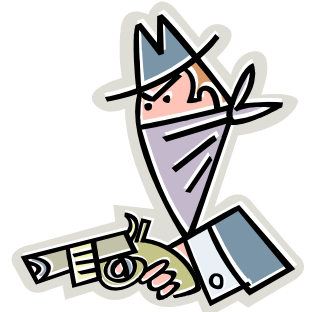


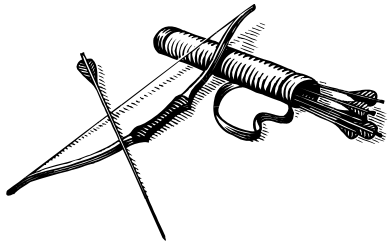

Starring: Audie Murphy, Marshall Thompson, Charles Drake, Jack Kelly

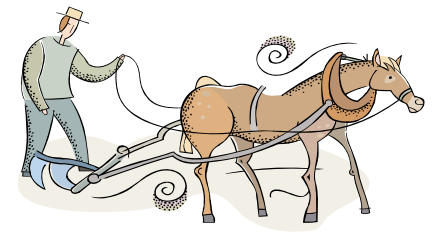


September 18: Sergeant York (1941)

Torn between religious pacifism and patriotism, Tennessee born Alvin York, a simple backwoods farm boy, went on to become the most acclaimed hero of WWI.

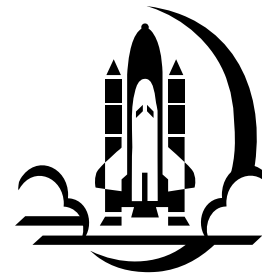
This movie had 11 academy award nominations, including best picture. This was Coopers first best actor academy award.

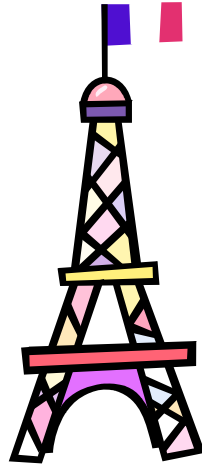
